

ATLANTA CHAPTER ARMA INTERNATIONAL CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this organization is ARMA International (Association of Records Managers and Administrators Inc.), Atlanta Chapter, herein referred to as Chapter. The Chapter was chartered on July 19, 1966 and incorporated in 1991.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

The objective of this non-profit, educational organization is to provide education, research, and networking opportunities to information professionals, to enable them to use their skills and experience to leverage the value of records, information, and knowledge as corporate assets and as contributors to organizational success.

ARTICLE III COMPOSITION OF THE CHAPTER

The chapter shall be composed of its members; officers elected by the members; a Board of Directors which, in addition to such duties as are prescribed in this Constitution and By-Laws, shall act as the policy-making body; committees of the Chapter; and appointed officers / committees as are necessary to accomplish its purpose.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

This ARMA International Chapter shall have four classes of members:

- A. Regular. A duly qualified individual in good standing with the Association, entitled to full rights and benefits of ARMA International.

- B. Honorary. An individual who has been granted life membership by ARMA International's Board of Directors. In some cases the Chapter Board may vote to give Chapter Honorary Membership.

- C. Student. Any enrolled full time post-secondary student. Student membership does not convey the privileges of voting in elections or holding office.

- D. Retired. A current or former member in good standing with the Association, who has retired from the profession of records management. Retired membership does not include the privilege of voting in elections or holding office.
